As a post chairman, you must also ensure that you and your committee follow this standard operating procedure ("SOP").

The purpose of this SOP is to provide county and post chairmen with definitive guidance and instructions necessary to nominate, select, and process deserving young men for attendance at ALJBS; including the selection criteria, interviewing processes, and the application and Medical/CampDoc procedures. Additionally, you will be given guidelines for fundraising. This SOP is designed to furnish you will a series of standardized processes and procedures that will be used by *all* of the American Legion Posts throughout the State of New Jersey. This standardization, by no means, is meant to take away your Post's individuality. Rather, it is designed to help guarantee that, indeed, the very best young men are chosen for our program with minimum effort on everyone's part.

Once again, thank you for your support of The American Legion Jersey Boys State, "A Week that Shapes the Future."

Purpose and Scope of this SOP

- 1. **Purpose:** The purpose of this SOP is to provide American Legion Post Boys State chairmen, their committees, and county chairmen with a series of standardized processes and procedures to be used to successfully send young men to American Legion Jersey Boys State each year.
- 2. **Scope:** This SOP applies to <u>ALL</u> Post Boys State Chairmen and County Chairmen in the New Jersey Department of the American Legion.
- 3. **Reference:** For you to become an experienced, expert County or Post chairman, you must take time to study the contents of the ALJBS Website. The website www.aljbs.org contains all of the information you will need to become a credible local voice for our program.

What is Jersey Boys State?

ALJBS is a mythical fifty-first state organized and administered for citizenship training purposes under the auspices of The American Legion, Department of New Jersey. A session of ALJBS has been held annually since the first session in 1946.

Known as "A Week that Shapes the Future," ALJBS educates our young men in the duties, privileges, rights and responsibilities of American citizenship. ALJBS endeavors to provide a foundation for understanding self-government, a rational approach toward the solution of public questions, and a faith in the ideals and processes of democracy. At ALJBS, the delegates gain a deeper understanding of American ideals and expand their knowledge of the underlying principles of government.

ALJBS provides a complete program of educational and recreational activities. A concert band is formed, a newspaper is published daily, and a portion of each afternoon is dedicated to an organized and supervised program of intramural athletics. Outstanding speakers and specialists in various fields contribute their expertise rounding out the annual session.

The instructional program at ALJBS is the delivered using three methods - seminars, functional activities, and general assemblies. Seminars are held in such subjects as government, law enforcement, legislative and election procedures. At the heart of the instructional program are a series of "hands-on" activities in citizenship practice, including the operation of the courts, legislative assemblies, administration of law enforcement, public welfare, etc. These activities take a considerable portion of the time allotted for instructional purposes and constitute the primary means through which citizens "learn by doing". As part of this "learn by doing" concept, the delegates are given the opportunity to run for selected city, county, and state offices during the week. This includes designing campaign materials, making political speeches, and campaigning within their cities, counties, and the state. Candidates are encouraged to run for office, but do not have to. They may help a fellow statesman by working on his election committee.

From the first day, and continuing throughout the program, general assemblies for all the ALJBS citizens are held. The purpose of these assemblies is to provide lectures on subjects which support the training program and to give leaders of the two political parties in Boys State an opportunity to present their platforms. The timetable for all of these activities is found in the daily schedule.

Daily, all citizens are required to attend one of the several seminars offered in such areas as law, law enforcement, leadership, and careers in education, engineering, the military, etc. Each citizen is permitted to attend the seminar of his choice each day.

ALJBS is a non-partisan political program. Issues are examined by the delegates without regard to the views of the existing political party system. This enables the young men to offer their own solutions free from political contamination and then to understand some of the political problems they will encounter in the adult world. The delegates are assigned to either the "Nationalist" or the "Federalist Jersey Boys State political parties. Neither of these parties reflect the principles of the major parties found in the state of New Jersey.

The size and composition of the staff varies in accordance with the number of young men attending the annual session. We require a large part-time staff for administrative and instructional activities, as well as a full-time, on-campus staff of approximately 160 individuals to direct the activities of 900 or more statesmen. This full-time staff of ALJBS is comprised of volunteers who are mostly former delegates and Legionnaires.

ALJBS delegates can now obtain three semester hours of college credit in political science through Rider University by registering and completing its course entitled POL 200, New Jersey Politics and Government. This course is managed through Rider's Rebovich Institute for New Jersey Politics. The instructional materials introduced in ALJBS constitute the academic work for POL 200. An additional paper, after completing ALJBS, rounds out the requirement for POL 200 completion. There is a separate fee required of the delegates for these college credits.

The Department of New Jersey, American Legion Auxiliary sponsors a separate but similar program for young women called **Jersey Girls State**.

County Chairman's Responsibilities

The position of the Boys State County Chairman is the key link between the ALJBS organization and the individual posts. For the posts, the County Chairman is the face of the Boys State program. As such, you must be available to aid the Post Chairmen in meeting their responsibilities. The County Boys State Chairmen are, therefore, responsible for:

- 1. Identifying the Post Boys State Chairs from the posts within the County (Department can provide a list) and establishing contact with them.
- 2. Providing any necessary training to ensure that they can properly execute their responsibilities.

- 3. Providing information updates to the American Legion County Meeting regarding the program, especially impending deadlines and key dates.
- 4. Monitoring the number of slots funded from each post and striving to maintain or exceed the numbers from prior years.
- 5. Reviewing the status of Boys State attendees from high schools within assigned county and working with posts and other organizations as necessary to attempt to provide the Boys State opportunity to all High Schools Juniors in the assigned county.
- 6. Monitoring the application status through the ALJBS website and assisting assigned post chairs as needed.
- 7. Scheduling a County Orientation meeting where statesmen and their parents will be provided with the information needed to properly prepare for Boys State.
- 8. Using the ALJBS website, generating a list of alternates from within the County and placing them into delegate slots as delegates drop out due to illness or other conflict. Of course, it is expected that when a delegate drops out, the sponsoring post will assign an alternate to fill the vacancy. But when the post has "used" all of the alternates, it is up to the County Chair to identify additional alternates that can fill the slot. In order to do this effectively, the County chair needs to be in contact with the post chairmen, especially in May and early June.

Post Chairman's Responsibilities

As with the County Chairmen, the Post Chairmen have a number of responsibilities that must be met in order for the Department's Boys State effort to succeed. The Post Boys State Chairmen are responsible for:

- 1. Coordinating the Post's Boys State business with the County Chairman when required and, when necessary, the Department Boys State Coordinator in Trenton.
- 2. Attending *all* mandatory training meetings, especially that which is held in Trenton annually in December.
- 3. Chairing periodic Post Boys State Committee meetings to conduct the business necessary to accomplish the responsibilities outlines in this SOP.
- 4. Establishing and maintaining good relationships with key personnel in the local high school(s) supported by their Post.
- 5. Completing the procedures outlined in this SOP for the nomination and selection of delegates and alternates from the local high school(s). *No* outside organization will select delegates. *This is the sole responsibility of the American Legion posts!*
- 6. Making certain that all delegates and alternates attend a county ALJBS orientation.

- 7. Helping the delegates and alternates complete the on-line ALJBS registration process.
- 8. Helping the delegates and alternates with the CampDoc medical registration process.
- 9. Communicating all pertinent information to the delegates and alternates.
- 10. Answering any questions that delegates and alternates may have concerning their attendance at ALJBS.
- 11. Raising funds to pay the ALJBS tuition.
- 12. Meeting all established deadlines (application, tuition payment, etc.).
- 13. Completing a final check to make certain that all delegates and alternates have completed the registration and CampDoc processes prior to arriving at ALJBS and that they are still planning to attend the session.
- 14. Securing publicity for the Post's Jersey Boys State effort.

Note: The above are the "minimum" responsibilities that must be completed by the Post Chairman. The individual posts may make additional demands on the Chairman, but may not change or eliminate those outlined above. Furthermore, the procedures and processes that follow later in this SOP may not be changed or eliminated.

Chairman Assignment

County Boys State Chairmen are selected by and serve at the pleasure of the County Commander. Likewise, Post Boys State Chairmen are selected by their respective Post Commanders and serve at their pleasure. These assignments are identified on the annual Post and County Officer Report. In the event that a chairman has to be assigned during the year, the respective Commander must submit a letter to Department that spells out the assignment. This letter, at a minimum, should include the Chairman's:

- * Full Name
- * Home Address
- * Home & Cell Telephone Numbers
- * Email Address
- * Effective Date of Assignment

Note: Only Legionnaires may be assigned as the Post and County Boys State Chairmen.

Maintaining Post/School Relationships

Each Post Boys State Chairman should spend time cultivating a good working relationship with their local high schools. In December, the Post Chairman should visit the high school(s) supported by the Post and meet with the Principal, guidance counselors, and other significant staff members to discuss that year's American Legion Jersey Boys State. The Chairman should ask the Principal to assign the duties of high school Boys State Coordinator to a high school staff member. The coordinator should act as a liaison between the school officials and the Post Chairman. The duties of the high school Boys State Coordinator include advertising Jersey Boys State in the school, coordinating the delegate nomination process with teachers, and aiding in setting up a room in which to conduct the Boys State interviews, if necessary. Additionally, the high school Boys State Coordinator would help to communicate important information to the delegates and alternates during the school year. To these ends, the Post Chairman should take time to train the high school Boys State Coordinator so he or she can meet his/her responsibilities. Make certain to encourage the school officials to visit The American Legion Jersey Boys State website at www.aljbs.org to gain a fuller understanding of our program.

The ALJBS Nomination Process

The Nomination Process

In December, set up an appointment with your local school contacts (high school Boys State Coordinator, guidance counselor, principal, etc.) at each school that your Post supports to review what Jersey Boys State is and what ALJBS provides its delegates. Ask the high school Boys State Coordinator to solicit the teachers' and guidance counselors' help in nominating deserving young men from the current junior class. Furnish the high school Boys State Coordinator with a letter that should be sent out to those who will nominate candidates. This letter should spell out what Jersey Boys State is and the criteria they should use when nominating candidates for ALJBS. Meet with the Coordinator and staff not later than December 20th each year.

(See Attachment 1 for a Sample of a Boys State Nomination Solicitation Letter)

Explain to the high school Boys State Coordinator that a young man has to meet the following criteria to qualify for a Jersey Boys State interview:

- 1. Only those who will successfully complete their junior year of high school and have at least one semester of high school remaining after attending ALJBS.
- 2. Will be no older than 17 when attending ALJBS.
- 3. Possesses outstanding qualities of leadership, character, scholarship, loyalty and service to their schools and community.

- 4. Has an interest in government and its processes.
- 5. Have a good academic standing.
- 6. The candidate and his parents must be residents of the state of New Jersey or have residency of record in New Jersey (in the case of military families).
- 7. Be willing to abide by the rules and traditions of Boys State and is available to attend during the dates of the ALJBS session.

Further, a nominee *does not* have to:

- 1. Attend a New Jersey high school (i.e., he may attend a private, out-of-state school)
- 2. Be a U.S. citizen.
- 3. Participate in high school student government.
- 4. Be a sports captain. etc.
- 5. Be an honor roll student.

Inform the high school Boys State Coordinator and other school officials of the following:

- 1. That you and other Post members will interview the candidates nominated by the school and make your selections.
- 2. Those who are selected are called "Delegates" and those who are **not** selected as a Delegate become "Alternates." If a Delegate becomes incapable of attending ALJBS, an Alternate will be chosen to take his place.

Note: Make sure to set a deadline for nomination submission. Ask the high school Boys State Coordinator(s) to collect all of the nomination responses from the teachers and guidance counselors. If, at all possible, retrieve the nominations personally so you can answer any questions that the Boys State Coordinator might have. The nomination process should be completed not later than January 30th.

The Interview Process

The interview is the most critical step in the process. Through this interview you have the opportunity to speak with each of the candidates to determine if they are suited to attend ALJBS. The Interview Process should be completed not later than the end of February each year.

The interview *must* be conducted by at least two Post members. At a minimum, one Legionnaire must be present at the interview. The remainder of the interview team may include Sons of the American Legion and/or ALJBS staff members who may be associated with the Post.

Note: Since ALJBS is an American Legion program, the interviews of candidates and selections of delegates and alternates *must not* be conducted by anyone who is not affiliated with the American Legion. In other words, the interviews and selections *will not* be conducted by outside organizations (i.e., Rotary Clubs, School Districts, political clubs, etc.).

The interview may take place anywhere there is suitable seating and environment. Some Posts have used school conference rooms, others use their Post facilities, and some use public library rooms. The main concern when interviewing is that the environment be quiet, comfortable, and free from interference from the general public.

A letter announcing the date, time, and place of the interview should be sent to the candidate. This may be handled by the high school Boys State Coordinator or by you through either the school distribution system or by U.S. Mail. In the event that the Post sends out the interview invitation letters by mail, you will need to obtain the candidates' addresses from the high school Boys State Coordinator. A schedule for the interviews should be given to the high school Boys State Coordinator so he/she can remind the candidate of the interview date and time.

Note: Try to be flexible in scheduling your interviews since some of the candidates may have legitimate conflicts with the dates you have set. The seasoned Post Chairmen will agree that, at times, it's necessary to have more than one interview date to accommodate all of the candidates.

(See Attachment 2 for a Sample Interview Invitation Letter)

At the appointed time, whether the interviews are conducted individually or in groups, greet the candidates, welcome them, and explain how the interview will be conducted. Also, explain the program and the role of the American Legion with the program. When asking questions, give the candidate ample time to prepare his answer. Remember, we are looking for not only what the candidate said in his answers, but also how he answered the questions in terms of poise, nervousness, confidence, credibility, and so on. Finally, during the interview, mention the college credit program, as well as the Samsung Scholarship (covered later in this SOP).

(See Attachment 3 for a Sample of Interview Questions) (See Attachment 4 & 5 for a Sample Interview Grading Sheets)

At the close of the interview, thank each candidate for his time and effort. Ask him if he has any questions concerning ALJBS or the American Legion. Let him know that you will contact him once the selections have been made.

The Selection Process

Once you have completed the interviews, you will make your delegate and alternate selections. This is best done through a team discussion of the interview results. The Selection Process should be completed not later than the end of March.

The selection process begins with a tabulation of the interview scores of the candidates. The selection criteria include a candidate's:

- 1. Scholastic Achievement (grade point average, class rank, etc.)
- 2. Leadership Qualities (Class government, clubs, and athletics, etc.)
- 3. Sense of Americanism/Patriotism
- 4. Character
- 5. Community service

The total scores of all candidates should be rank ordered from highest to lowest. Then, those candidates with the highest scores should be selected as Delegates. Those with the lower scores, should be designated as Alternates. Finally, those who have not demonstrated the traits required of a Jersey Boys State Delegate or Alternate should be eliminated. Obviously, the amount of available funds for Boys State purposes will drive the number of Delegates you can choose. Fundraising will be addressed later in this SOP.

Note: When making your selection of delegates and alternates, do not rule out someone with a physical or other form of disability or challenge. ALJBS prides itself as an equal opportunity program. If you have a young man who is otherwise qualified to attend, but has a particular "challenge," that **should not,** in any way, disqualify the candidate. ALJBS has and will continue to meet their needs. We ask that you notify the Department Boys State Coordinator so she/he can pass that information along to the Executive Director of the program so the necessary preplanning may be completed before the young man arrives at ALJBS.

Once your selections have been made, you must inform the young men who have been chosen to represent your Post either as Delegates or as Alternates. The preferred method of doing so is a personal letter sent from you as the Post Chairman or from the Post Commander. Some Posts also send a letter to the Delegates' or Alternates' parents. Parents are an important part of the acceptance and application processes, so involve them in the process.

Note: Ask the parents for their phone numbers and email addresses in order to keep them informed.

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The Application Process

Today, Jersey Boys State relies on an on-line application process. In your selection letter to delegates and alternates, invite each to begin the application process by visiting www.aljbs.org and clicking on "Become a Delegate" and scroll down to "Application Process."

This page lists everything that a delegate or alternate needs to know about applying to Jersey Boys State. It also provides a link to the "On-Line Application System." After clicking on that link, the delegates and alternates will be prompted to begin the application process. On average, the application should take each young man about 30 minutes to complete. They do not have to

complete the application in one sitting. Rather, they can reopen the application to make corrections or complete the remainder of the application as time permits.

Note: There is a segment on the website entitled "Applicants sponsored by NJ American Legion posts" that gives a complete set of instructions of how to complete the application. Each year, familiarize yourself with the application process in order to answer any questions you receive from delegates and alternates or parents.

Once they have completed the application, each delegate or alternate must print the application. After printing the application, he will need to:

- 1. have his parent or guardian fill in the insurance portion of the application;
- 2. the delegate should sign the application on the appropriate line,
- 3. have a parent or guardian sign on the appropriate line,
- 4. take his application to school and have his principal complete the verification section.

At this point, decide how to proceed with collecting the applications. The instructions on the website direct the delegates and alternates to deliver the completed applications (after the principal completes the verification) to the sponsoring Post. As an alternative, ask the principal's office hold the fully completed applications for you to collect. Or, have them mailed to you by the principal's office. Keep in mind that, if the applications are lost in the mail, each delegate and alternate must print and complete steps 1 through 4 above again. Whatever method you choose, make certain to inform the delegates and alternates what will happen after the principal signs their applications. The application process should be completed not later than May 15th each year.

All completed applications, must contain a Post Number, Delegate or Alternate status, all signatures, insurance information, principal's verification and signature. Then, sign each completed application and mail them to:

Note: As a Post Chairman, you will receive an instruction sheet from Department early in the year that will provide the information necessary to process the young men for ALJBS. This will include the log-in for you to access the "ALJBS.org: On-Line Application System Status" segment of the website.

Monitoring Delegate/Alternate Application Progress


As the delegates and alternates progress through the application process, periodically check their progress. You can do so using the ALJBS.org: On-Line Application System Status tool. This segment of the SOP will walk you through how to use this tool.

To access and use the On-Line Application System Status tool, follow the instructions below:



1. Go to: https://www.aljbs.org/appstatus

Click on "Please Log-In to Proceed." Then, enter the Username and Password that was sent to you by email/letter from ALJBS. (The letter should arrive early in the year)




2. Type your Post Number (Post Chairman) or Select your County (for a County Chairman)



3. For both Post and County Chairmen, you will find a list of the Alternates and

Delegates from your Post or County. As the delegates and alternates begin the application process, use this tool to check on applicant's progress. There will be three initial status indicators: Delegate (or Alternate), Incomplete and Complete.

- 1. **Incomplete** means that the applicant has not as yet completed the application. Generally, each has all the information necessary on the form but has not printed the form. When an application is marked "Incomplete," you do not have access to the application form itself.
- 2. **Complete** means everything has been added to the application and the form has been printed by the applicant. At this stage, you can open the form by clicking on the little triangle next to the word Delegate or Alternate and a drop-down menu appears (below).



From this menu, you can click on "link to Form" at the bottom and the Delegate's or Alternate's application will open. Once opened, you can check the form. Keep in mind that the applicant must complete the form, along with his parents and principal before getting it to you for your final check and signature. (See the next page for a sample completed application.)

Note: When checking your Post's applicants, if you cannot find a young man's application, go back to the beginning and, instead of entering your Post's number in the "Enter Post #" space, enter 0. You may find that he didn't put the Post Number on his application. The system is set to assign an applicant to Post #0 if the Post Number is left blank. At that point, you can contact the young man and ask him to reopen his application and place your Post number in the proper space. Also, encourage the Alternates to go through the application process, explaining that, if a slot opens, they may be selected to attend. Then, encourage them to plan on going to Rider University on the designated start date of ALJBS to compete for a Delegate slot. Generally, all alternates are admitted to ALJBS, but there is no guarantee that will happen.

ALJBS – CampDoc online Medical Form Instructions

Background Information

Beginning in 2019, All Applicants will be required to complete an online electronic health record with CampDoc. In addition to being a HIPAA compliant electronic health record system, it will also be a valuable tool for our volunteer EMS team, allowing them to quickly access important medical information at the time they are administering care. This secure solution will be greatly beneficial and a marked improvement over the printed Medical Form we used in the past.

Applicants can begin their Medical Form by logging into <u>apply.alibs.org</u>. Once their on-line application is complete they will see a link for "Medical Form" where they will directed to campdoc.com to begin the registration process. The one-time link that is provided will expire in 60 minutes. Please note: applicants will receive a weekly email from CampDoc until their profile is 100% complete!



Instructions:

<u>Step 1</u>: In order to complete the Medical Form via CampDoc, the applicant email used to complete the Online Application System (apply.aljbs.org) should log back in to the Application system.

NOTE: You should use the SAME email that was used to create the initial application.

<u>Step 2</u>: Once logged in, you should see Medical Form as depicted below in two spots: top navigation bar AND on the welcome page. Click either "Start Medical Form here" or "Medical Form" from the top navigation:



The CampDoc registration replaces the paper medical form that Delegates and Alternates had to fill in by hand and take to their physicians as part of a physical for ALJBS. From this point

forward, the Delegates and Alternates will open the CampDoc app and complete a medical history. When finished, they will print the form and take it to their physician for verification and signature. After that, they will upload a copy of the physician's verification on CampDoc. As pointed out above, this system will aid the ALJBS medical staff to access a Statesman's medical history more quickly in case of an emergency or need for medical assistance when at Jersey Boys State.

Making Alternate to Delegate Changes

If, during the period between Delegate/Alternate selection and reporting to ALJBS, a delegate chooses to withdraw for any reason, you should assign the vacant slot to an Alternate. If the withdrawal occurs prior to you sending the delegate applications to Headquarters, merely contact the Alternate and inform him that a Delegate has withdrawn and that he is now designated a Delegate. At this point, ask him to reopen his application and change his status from Alternate to Delegate. In the event that he has already completed the application and has all of the signatures and verifications completed, but the application has not been sent to Headquarters, have him change his on-line application to reflect the Delegate status. Then, you cross out the Alternate and write in Delegate on his paper application. If the change takes place after you have submitted the applications, call the Headquarters Jersey Boys State Coordinator at (609) 695-5418 and inform him/her that Delegate X has withdrawn and Alternate Y replaces him as a Delegate.

If a change is necessary, and you do not have any Alternates in your Post roster, contact the County Chairman and ask him/her to give you a name of an Alternate to take the place of the Delegate who has withdrawn. After the assignment has been made, the County Chairman will call the Headquarters Jersey Boys State Coordinator and inform him/her of the change. After the change has been made, you should go into the On-Line Application System Status tool, sign in, and get the contact information from the Alternate's application. Then, contact the Alternate to let him know that he will be attending ALJBS representing your Post as a Delegate. Contact should be by telephone, if possible, and followed up with an email confirming your conversation. Again, follow the instructions in the above paragraph for handling the application, depending on where on the timeline the change is made.

Fundraising

At the beginning of each year, the Post Chairman and his/her committee should begin raising the funds necessary to pay the Delegates' ALJBS tuition. Fundraising is not easy, but it can be less difficult if you solicit the help of as many Post members as possible.

You should look at a number of different sources of funds. First and foremost, talk with the Post members to see if any Legionnaire families would like to either sponsor a young man outright or to contribute what they can to the Post Boys State fund. Next, ask your Post to sponsor a Delegate or two. Additional sources of funds include:

1. local businesses (restaurants, pharmacies, family owned shops, car dealerships, banks, Realtors, etc.),

- 2. local civic or political clubs (Democrat or Republican clubs, Elks, Moose, etc.)
- 3. service organizations (The Rotary International Club, etc.),
- 4. local school districts that your Post services,
- 5. local PTAs or teacher associations,
- 6. local police fraternal organizations (PBA, FOP, etc.),
- 7. labor unions,
- 8. Post Riders and Auxiliary, and SAL,
- 9. Other Veterans organizations (VFW, Disabled Vets of America, etc.),
- 10. Fraternal Organizations (Masonic Lodges, Odd Fellows, etc.),
- 11. Military organizations (Reserve or National Guard Units),
- 12. Political Parties and Local Office Holders.

You may want to consider conducting raffles (basket of cheer, etc.), 50/50 drawings, and place a jar on the bar (if your Post has an active canteen). You may be able to get a television or computer donated by a "big box" appliance or electronics store for a raffle item. Some restaurants may donate a \$50 gift certificate that you can raffle off. Some Posts have been successful in holding a periodic spaghetti dinner or some other form of community gathering where the profits go to Boys State. Ask your Riders, Auxiliary, and SAL for help in putting on a dinner.

When you approach someone to contribute to the Boys State fund, make sure that you have a letter that explains what Jersey Boys State is.

Note: Keep in mind that there are legal issues associated with conducting raffles, 50/50s and such. You should discuss your fundraising concerns with the Post house committee and ask its help in securing the required permits, etc. Also, with a tuition of only \$250, ALJBS is one of the best (and cheapest) youth leadership programs of its kind in New Jersey. (\$250 is not a lot to ask for from any of the sponsors)

ALJBS College Credit Program

Beginning with the 74th Session (2019), Rider University will grant three semester hours of college credit to all ALJBS Statesmen who apply for the credit. For information concerning this new college credit program, go to: www.aljbs.org/collegecredit. After reviewing the college credit program outlined on the ALJBS Website, if you still have questions, contact the Dean of Education by emailing deanofeducation@aljbs.org. Both Post and County chairmen should encourage the Delegates to apply for this program as it is a very cost-effective way of receiving three transferrable credit hours through Rider University.

Samsung Scholarship

The **Samsung American Legion Scholarship** is available for high school juniors who participate in the current session of Boys State or Girls State and are direct descendants (or legally adopted children) of wartime veterans eligible for American Legion membership. The Samsung scholarship awards up to \$20,000 for undergraduate studies (e.g., room and board, tuition and books), and each applicant is selected according to his or her involvement in school and community activities, academic record and financial need.

Students who qualify for and are interested in the Samsung scholarship can download an application by going to www.aljbs.org and clicking on "Become a Delegate" then scrolling down and clicking on "Samsung Scholarship." Please note that the scholarship is restricted to high school juniors participating in the current session of Boys State or Girls State; youth who participated in either program the previous year cannot reapply for the scholarship.

County ALJBS Orientations

The County Chairman is responsible for planning and scheduling the ALJBS Orientation for his/her county. In the case where a county traditionally pairs with a neighboring county for orientation, the Chairman should contact the other county chair to jointly plan and schedule the event. It is mandatory that an ALJBS staff member must attend each county orientation to support the County Chairman. A location should be chosen that is large enough to accommodate the delegates, alternates and their parents for the event. ALJBS has a PowerPoint orientation presentation for your use, you can contact Mr. James McManus at jmcmanus@aljbs.org and request a copy. If you plan to use this presentation, you should have the proper audio-visual equipment available, if at all possible.

Note: The County Chairman needs to work with the ALJBS staff to schedule the event.

The Post Chairmen, in turn, will inform their Delegates, Alternates, and their parents of the date and place of the county orientation. Finally, the Post Chairmen are encouraged to attend the county orientations.

Developing a Community News Presence

Nothing helps to "sell" a program such as Jersey Boys State more than a "good news" story. People just love to read the so-called "local boys make good" stories and ALJBS gives ample opportunities to "local boys" all around the State of New Jersey to "make good."

As a post chairman, some of your most important allies are the local newspapers, community newsletters, school district newsletters and local access television. A well written press release or nicely produced television spot or interview are wonderful ways to get the Jersey Boys State story out into the community. An article about your Post's Boys State effort which includes the names of the Delegates and the donors and contributors will help to give the Jersey Boys State a face in the community and may even help with contributor development and fund generation.

ALJBS Project 1000 Initiative

There are a number of high schools throughout the state of New Jersey that are not covered by an American Legion Post. As a result, many young men who were otherwise eligible to attend ALJBS were not given the opportunity to do so. Beginning in 2017, ALJBS began an initiative known as Project 1000 to make young men in these schools more aware of Jersey Boys State and give them an opportunity to apply for a slot at ALJBS without sponsorship from an American Legion Post.
