#### The Honorable Governor Benjamin Duvelson Governor of the 76th Session of Jersey Boys State

The 76th session of ALJBS has elected Federalist Benjamin Duvelson to the office of Boys State Governor. Governor Duvelson comes from Union Township in Union County and currently resides in Taylor City in Vandenberg County. He attends Union High School and is sponsored by American Legion Post #35 in Union. He wanted to make a special shout out to the man who sponsored him, Robert Gentry of American Legion Post #35.

In the Federalist primary, Duvelson stood out from the other candidates by displaying his incredibly blunt openness and honesty. It was by far the most radical approach taken by any of the candidates. He promised to improve the 51st state by improving schools, cleaning up corruption, and inflation. Duvelson after the fact reflected, "I worked from a base of extreme honesty, I made sure everyone knew exactly how I felt on a topic even if it cost my own chances. ### The Gubernatorial Debate

Charlie Costal, the Nationalist, marched out with confidence, taking the podium with electrifying energy. Walking down from the podium onto the floor, Costal directly presented his bipartisan platform, aiming to connect with constituents about his detailed plans to reform New Jersey, specifically promising to improve the state's broken and underfunded infrastructure.


Ben Duvelson, the Federalist, targeted inflation, using the gripes of the audience about rising gas prices as a launch point for his argument about education. Ben argued that teachers affected by high gas prices would need to be compensated with fairer pay and higher pensions to keep them from leaving. Duvelson used a strange tactic often in his speaking, consistently tying back his more specific arguments on policy to his campaign slogan of "Love conquers all", then making a heart symbol with his hands to especially convey his compassion for his constituents.

The Federalist audience got behind his platform, buying in wholeheartedly (no pun intended) by making hearts with their hands and raising them in approval whenever they agreed with one of Ben's points. In fact, one of the key dividers that separated the Federalist audience from the Nationalists was the intense enthusiasm of the Federalists. The Federalists jumped to their feet whenever their governor crossed the stage to speak, clapping and cheering, using the heart as their handmade symbol, and praising the popular Lieutenant Governor candidate Bruce Dixon by loudly and longly chanting his name. Though many Nationalists believed the Federalist audience was booing their candidate whenever he left the stage

when they were in fact chanting "BRUCE!" in baritone, booming support.

During the Q and A session, the candidates reused their previous talking points, caught up in the stressful nature of improvised answers. Ben used personal anecdotes based on his parents' lessons about compassion, while Charlie focused on his own merits as a statesman, citing his powerful and dynamic personality as an asset in legislative negotiations. Neither candidate gained from the questions of the audience section of the debate, though again the Federalist section made sure to make themselves heard. In the end the debate was fairly even: neither of the candidates showed themselves to be greater than the other by a large margin. But the debate did reveal one crucial election factor: the general apathy of the Nationalists compared to the fiery partisanism of the Federalists.

### **Bomb Diffusion on Campus**

TICK.... TICK.... TICK.... And hopefully, no BOOM.

A member of the bomb squad came to Boys State on Thurday for a seminar (Located outside the BLC). Instead of boring us with a long, drawn out speech, State Policeman Steve Christinzio got right into the action. He brought with him a \$70,000 dollar drone and a full body Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) suit. The drone can climb up stairs, get multiple camera angles, and use a metal claw attached to the end that is controlled with a remote.

During a live demonstration, its metal claw was extended to pick up a water bottle. It carried the bottle to another attendee at the seminar. Then, Officer Christinzio wanted to display the stair climbing and so the robot slowly rolled up the stairs outside the BLC. The first bomb teams date back to the Second World War when British Home Guard units would remove unexploded bombs from the streets of London. The bomb suit is made out of heavily-layered kevlar, plastic, and foam--no heavier materials or metal involved! *The Hurt Locker* is a great example of a bomb unit in action during the Iraq insurgency, and is a great watch for a rainy day.

### Boys State Municipal Courts v. The Jersey Statesmen

#### SHARKS!!!



A vast majority of people are afraid of sharks. Negatively portrayed in media like Jaws and Shark Week these predators have generated a lot of fear and anxiety. But are Sharks really the cold killers of the sea? Let's take a deep dive and explore these beasts that lay beneath.

A fear of sharks is very understandable: the teeth, the cold uncaring eyes, and predator status all scream something anyone sane should be afraid of. If something like that was swimming at me I would be scared, especially of that mouth. But shark attacks are a very rare occurrence, having less than 72 attacks annually and only killing 11 people annually. For perspective, a vending machine kills 13 people annually, around 20 people die on swing sets, not to mention that beds kill 450 people annually. Sharks attack because humans vaguely resemble their prey, a seal, so when they do a taste bite and get prickly bones instead of blubbery skin, a majority of the time the sharks will swim away. The bed you sleep on is more likely to end your life than a shark, but even still your odds of an attack lower even more if you wear an electronic shark deterrent band that messes with sharks internal navigation. Sharks like any other predator are not malicious, they are animals who need to eat, yet even still there remains a huge fear of sharks that is not apparent with any other predator. The media we consume is likely the biggest reason for this fear, prior to Jaws the mass public knew or cared little about sharks. However the movie and its horror element started the trend of fear surrounding these creatures that would only continue to grow. The excess attention and fear towards sharks ironically turned humans into threats for sharks.

Sharks push water through their gills by swimming, letting oxygen into their body. If the shark stops moving it cannot breathe and quickly suffocates. Shark finning is the process of removing a shark's dorsal fin, usually for cuisine or traditional medicine. A dorsal fin usually goes between \$10,000 - \$20,000. The industry is worth \$100 million dollars and annually kills about 100 million sharks each year. This mixed with habitat destruction and pollution has decimated shark populations. A study done in conjunction with Discovery looked at shark populations over the past 50 years and found that most populations saw a drop in their population up to 70%.

Sharks are incredible animals and have no malicious intent against humans. However, what is malicious is the killing of sharks for fins. Returning their body back into the ocean forcing them to drown because they can't move is horrid and raises the big question: who's the real monster in the deep?
