Seminars, Summed Up

WALL STREET was led by Senior Wall Street Executive David Scordato and Senior Financial Advisor of Fidelity Investments, Robert Taylor. The seminar touched upon necessary characteristics for the business field and advice for potential future investments. The presenters closed with a demonstration, where two delegates were asked to volunteer and advertise a security.

EMERGENCY MEDICINE was led by Ms. Mary Danish, RN. Delegates learned of the premier emergency services that New Jersey provides to the East Coast. Danish, a member of New Jersey's Task Force 1 herself, was more than qualified in emergency medicine. Delegates were also shown very intereresting photos from some of Ms. Danish's "more minor" cases.

REAL ESTATE was led by Mehul Patel, Senior Project Manager of the Hudson Companies, and Randy Pear, Senior Vice President of Insignia/ESG. The speakers enlightened delegates on the requirements, career options, and linvestment options future realtors should know.

ARCHITECTURE focused on building a solid future. Structural Engineer Sean O'Neill led the statesmen in a group discussion on the various design fundamentals of construction. Gaining insight on a possible future career path, statesmen learned the job description of architects and engineers. The seminar concluded on the topic of "going green" in which O'Neill taught delegates how architects work to design an Earth-friendly and energy-sufficient community.

LAW ENFORCEMENT was led by Capt. Bill Baig, Lt. Bruce Melson, and Trooper Adam Polhemus. The role of local and state police in New Jersey safety, potential careers in law enforcement, and the training necessary to become a police officer were topics discussed. He then taught himself the method to solve the cube by researching algorithms online.

Hsu has since whittled down his times for many events while attending many United States competitions. Hsu currently holds an incredible world record: in less than four seconds in the 2x2 speed solve.

Standing at 6'1", Ken Mack of Ridgeway County showed strong leadership and athletic skills in leading Ridgeway County to a surprising and significant win over Vandenburg County in intense match of volleyball. Ridgeway, consisting of Tyler City and Polk City, suffered a devastating loss in game one. Confidence was shattered, and Vandenburg predicted more immediate damage. The climax of the match occurred when Mack came into the game and gave hope to the team by donating a majority of the points, allowing Ridgeway to win the next two games, and the volleyball match, 2-1.
